Questions for the mind:

1. Jesus is said to be “seated at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven” (Heb. 8:1). This is said 4 times in Hebrews (1:3; 8:1; 10:12; 12:2). What are the 3 things that pastor Kenny said this term implied? Why are those important in our faith? Name a few ways that this differs from the “Old Covenant.”

2. Hebrews 8:5 refers to the “tent” or the “tabernacle” or the “temple,” and the Old Testament priestly ministry as a “copy” or “shadow” of heavenly things. What are some examples of copy’s or shadows in the Old Testament? How are those fulfilled in the New.

3. Read Jeremiah 17:1 and 31:31-34. The reason the Old Covenant is inadequate is not because there is something wrong with it (Rom. 7:7-8), but there is something wrong with us. What does Jer. 17:1 say that is written on the heart? What are some of the terms Jer. 17:9 uses to describe the heart? What does Jer. 31:33 promise to do to the heart? How does that give freedom?

4. Study Romans 7:7-17 and answer the question, why did God give me the law? How does that possibly relate to the scribe seated at the left hand of the Sanhedrin?

Questions for the heart:

1. How does knowing that Jesus is seated at the right hand impact your security in Christ?
